you Congratulations You are amongst incredible company and I hope you I hope you take it because you deserve it It's awesome I want to be there I want to be at the Emmys I you know I text messaged my buddy Wendy Rich last night Um and she responded at 11 p.m. She probably was out partying celebrating because she should be you know she's a show runner of General Hospital Um Oh and another congratulatory to our um our buddy um Mr Martech he has been nominated for best casting in a daytime television series Yeah that goes was no surprise One of the nicest nicest people I have ever met such a sweetheart and really gave us so much so much wisdom when he came on our show and he's so generous to actors and you know he came to you and he didn't come to you but he saw you in a play I really appreciate it And you then you were on General Hospital shortly after it was probably that's like the quintessential moment for me as an actor where it was like I got offered the play from you know actually can I tell a little story please please please all of my hard workers out there all of my dreamers because I was having a rough go at it and fast forward what was like about seven months and I'm on General Hospital and I'm talking about like probably one of the roughest parts of my life and just keeping my head down Staying true to what I believed in from the get go Seven fast forward Seven months I'm on General Hospital So anyway I was um I had nothing going on for like a year I think I was this is 2009 18 Uh I was dating a girl that was in the Redlands 90 miles outside of L A So it was like I know but it was taking me away from the business and I was I really was I booked like one commercial and like one music video for we were distracted too Yeah I was very distracted and I was very removed from you know I mean I think I lost two roles from not being in town They like hey can we see you today I was like hey can I come tomorrow And they're like sure And then they text me like later that night like hey we made the decision You don't have to come in tomorrow because someone showed up that day and like convinced them and that's how casting works anyhow And that's how casting works I was chasing a few films I was with this producer we were chasing films and uh he was you know I I was really with him on producing and creating this film to get started And uh he was kind of downplaying me in a lot of different ways like oh OK he would inadvertently tell me you're not the lead You can't be the you're not a lead mind you he's no one like he's not done anything before I had people that created like actual like 10 year old TV shows telling me I'm a lead So it was really like contradicting Yeah Yeah Yeah Uh We go into a meeting uh with a casting director popular casting director from NCIS and

we're trying to cast for this film We we're doing uh and I get broken up with two hours before I go to the meeting Well it wasn't like a breakup I went on a first date and the girl was like hey I don't really think we have a connection Uh Wait you said it was a break up though That's why I just I just said it technically it wasn't like a break up It was just a first date It was the first day you told me she didn't want to go on a second date but it was two hours before I went in there I was kind of like whatever And I was already a romantic and I was already having like a tough go at it Anyway We go in there and he's just downplaying me He's like oh Kyle is just here but I'm the guy you need to talk to and it was just like in my head I was just like whatever dude just like let's just get this done kind of a thing And I remember her looking at me a couple of times and just like turning your head and going back into the meeting gets calls me in two days later and goes I really enjoyed the way you dealt with the negative energy in that room I would like to work with you not him And and that was the first that was the first straw of like dealing with negativity in a very positive way It will get you to where you need to be It's really easy to be positive when things are working out Totally When things are not going your way when things look like you know you were wrong you're in the wrong place to still stay true to yourself I'm telling you good things are right on the other side of that door She offered me a play That's the one that offered me so much I love that so much I'm just I'm just checking because I think I have a message from our uh from our buddy um who's coming and he's on his he's almost here um which is exciting Um yeah because I because I was checking the time I just wanna make sure he was ok because because you know like people everyone has my number to make sure I always wanna make sure all of our guests are ok They know where they're going and all that Um I love that story about you because what's so great about you is you're so good at being in the moments and being able to navigate I don't know if you learn that from your mom or your dad your dad your dad Is he a Pisces He a oh a Leo and a Pisces That might be tough No we're like so alike Oh very Kindred Oh if we do have any disagreements or arguments I mean by this time he's he doesn't have the energy to argue with me anymore He's just like whatever fine But uh yeah we we we you know we're doing it I love it I love it and I love you Um you know who else we love We want to give a special congratulatory Miss Shery She Daytime Emmy nominee for hosting What I love about This is that Sherry has known that she has wanted to have a talk show for a very very long time She's also a slate v uh former host alum like her alma mater Yeah

push the Jari to the limit and uh we are gonna take a look at the this works what's this This works That car vacuum Awesome Very cool And we could even take a look at Tabi used it And uh how amazing is this Oh my goodness You can just keep on going and going and going You can get into every little nook and cranny in your car with all of this How awesome So this is what we're gonna do We're gonna stick it into our query Let's do it this way So you guys can see what I'm doing Turn it on It's a little light and the display have gone on because we are about to fire this up Thank you Mr Jay There we go That is cool So let's see what else we can fire up today I mean that you can I mean that is just so cool You see powerful vacuum Jackie fired it up Let's have a look at some of the other things that we can um fire up today Let's see Here we go So let's try back to Good Day live Today is Wednesday April 26th 2023 We're so happy you're in the studio with me Kyle and I'm Michelle for just tuning in for the very first time and our special guest Mr Albert Pro Thank you Welcome to our show Thanks for joining us I have so much that I want to read about you because you're so you're an entrepreneur You're a dad you're a business owner Well entrepreneur all that stuff I just have to read this You're a business strategist entrepreneur the founder of the mortgage guys Um You are a start after public speaker business coach passion for helping others achieve their goals and reach their full potential You have over 15 years of experience in the mortgage industry I know you're only 40 years old Albert is known for his expertise in real estate finance leadership and marketing And you've been featured in various media outlets including Forbes Entrepreneur and the Huffington Post I can't even read half the things that you've done How are you Very good Thank you for having me and uh just blessed to be here Well we're blessed that you're here on our show Um It said 15 years ago you got into this mortgage actually more like 21 I was gonna ask because 15 would put you right at the collapse from the mortgage Like I started like around 19 like when I was 19 I'm I'm I just turned 40 a couple of weeks ago So thank you Were you when you were 19 Were you watching that packaging happen And then you were like what what's going on here with ABC And D packages for mortgages Well when I was 19 I was very new to to real estate So I I started as a real real estate assistant So I used to put the signs for the realtor and the and then just stay at the open house and and then I got discouraged a little bit because it wasn't as easy as I thought I got into real estate because I used to see all the realtors that drove BM BMW S Mercedes Rolex watches that show on million dollar million dollar listing show Yeah I don't think that was around

though because that was like a long time ago when I yeah when I was 19 it was like a long time ago So I started in real estate and then I transitioned to become a loan officer right after that I I didn't last as a realtor I didn't like it Ok Yeah Ok And loan officer to how did that transition into the next thing So I was a loan officer and I lost everything in 2008 So the mortgages the the not the ABC DS but the mortgages when when I started where we had a a an option arm Do you remember those No I don't Uh So we had an option arm mortgages So these were like negative So for exam for example like if you wanted to buy a million dollar home and you worked as a videographer we could say that you made 20,000 a month stated income So you didn't have to prove anything It was it was in full do full docs So it was just stated income And all you said is uh I make 20 K a month They would call your supervisor Does he work here Self employed Uh is he one of your sales people Yeah Yeah cool Yeah he does Ok cool 20 K a month you would qualify for a million dollar home but in order to pay that mortgage because a million dollar whole mortgage was let's just say 8000 a month So 8000 a month you wouldn't have to pay 8000 a month You would only pay 4000 a month and the extra 4000 would would roll over and go into your principal balance So we had people that would team up and let's say the mortgage was four grand a month It was supposed to be AAA grand but they'll have like four people living there and everybody would pitch in like 1000 1000 So people were living and mansions and then the properties were going up and then 2008 happens Boom and they correct all of that So that's what happened So my first uh little stint I made 260,000 my first year Yeah my 1st 12 months in in as a mortgage loan officer but then that didn't last I I lost everything after that Well that's did you see the picture Yeah Yeah Yeah I saw that essentially about you Yeah Yeah I mean not not not about you you personally right now but but about people like me it wasn't like the Wolf of Wall Street movie where it's about Jordan Belfort but it but it was maybe they did do it after me I don't know You know maybe you got royalties coming here Um That's really interesting though So you um you lost everything in 2008 that some of the country did a good part of the country did Um where did you go from there So when I lost everything I just I I was so embarrassed to go back to my parents' house because my my dad and my mom always told me don't get into real estate It's not like you think it is it's not BMW S and and Mercedes and Rolex and Girls It's not like that you should go to college because uh all your cousins and all the kids you grew up with they went to college and the right thing to do to become successful in and in this country is the American

dream Get your degree and make your 60 K a year and go work for a company Have security So that's what I that's what they they they always told me to do So I didn't want to be a failure and go back to them and tell them hey you were right I should have got my degree not dropped out of college and and avoided real estate but I didn't want to be a failure So I just decided to stay in my car for two months and it lasted two months After two months I got out of my car How did you feel when they used to tell you go to college and you had your own dreams your own play I hated it Right Right So how did you deal with that with with your parents telling you to do one thing And you had your own dream I was a big rebel II I used to run out of the house Uh I said I'm leaving I I used to uh throw tantrums I used to say I'm not gonna like III I didn't like if there's anything that I don't like in in this world it's a school like traditional school I love it Yeah I think I think you and myself are the same on that because I was taught at a very young age that I was a terrible writer communicator And this is what I do for a living I communicate like I tell stories I write stories I have host my own show Like I know I was watching your interview yesterday But for our viewers that are watching you two had a tough time as a little guy in school And why was that for you Well because when I grew up I didn't know any English I was born here so I'm Mexican American My parents are Mexican I'm first generation American and I didn't speak any English because my parents only knew Spanish So they taught me Spanish And when I was six they decided you know what I don't want you to go to school here locally because it's the ghetto you're gonna turn into a gangster 18th street and uh or not for Salvadorans I'm not Salvadoran I'm Mexican So I would go to 18th Street So they thought I was gonna be like an 18th street and and and do that So they said no you know what we're gonna send you to uh the Granada Hills and you're gonna take the school bus So at six I got into the school bus and I went to Granada Hills and it's the first time I've seen people like like with blue eyes and light skin and like yellow hair and I'm like who are these people And I'm like I I'm like I'm like what's going on here And then and then they they're talking to me and I don't understand them So I'm just like oh wow like what And and you know long story short uh they started calling me wet back go back to Mexico and yes a little guy because I mean my first ride on the bus uh I got on the head somebody got me on the head lock I was crying the whole way So I was crying the whole way It it was a disaster So I think that's why I hated school so much But uh eventually you know I learned English little by little and I I was very insecure and then I just grew

out of that insecurity and when I got out of high school and college I dropped out of college I tried it for like a year and I all I I just did college because they gave me something called grants So they used to give me uh financial assistance because I was I was low income and grants But the cool thing is that the grants you don't have to pay them back the grants As long as you take the classes they give you like a check for like two grand and you could do whatever you want with that check It's for school So I said well if I'm gonna go to school I need to look good So I need to go shop I went to Nordstrom Blooming bought some nice clothes and I was there in school and I learned how to drink and I learned how to how to how to connect with women and and and and that that was like that's what I learned college and and I'm very thankful for college for that because I I love women and I love good clothes And and then I dropped out after that was over And then I said well I don't like this I'm not gonna become rich because I always wanted to be a millionaire So I said you know that sorry to interrupt you I a really young dude because I feel like we know as little people we know what we kind of want to do We kind of have a sense of the overall goal At six Did you want to be a mega millionaire Yes because at six I started working and that's why our our daughter Italia she's six and she works Now we have the video I think if we can play it We have the video from your Instagram of you interviewing her She did a 40 minute podcast Yeah I love that so much Um I think Andy's gonna pull this up in a second Italia is she's six years old Um Absolutely adorable Um And it's so cute watching you talk to her Um Kyle wants to be a it wants to be a father of three girls and I will call you for sure I'm not sure if I want three girls I have a feeling I'm gonna have three girls Got it got it got it Well girls are the most loving So so like the the the boys they they're born and they love dad You're a role model but then the girl takes them away from you and you never see them again Now now they spend their time with the girlfriend's family A girl they take the they they take they take everybody to you So so like girls bully guys So the if you have daughters she's gonna get the boy and they're gonna grow up right Get married everything you're gonna have granddaughters grandsons whatever And she's gonna pull them to you and then the the the boy's family is gonna have some issues because they're not gonna see the family a lot So that's that that's that's what I see happening Daughters are always attached to the the mom and dad my brother is 100% like I I have my own family I'm doing my own thing And me on the other hand I'm like my mom my dad I'm all about like I'm all about bringing like the boyfriend and my mom and dad And yeah

so um that we had a guest on who said they believe that the father chooses the sex of the baby Did you want girls I wanted a boy because I always wanted to have uh like somebody that's gonna be myself but like a junior like me and and carry the torch But then when I had my first girl uh I got I fell in love with her because because the my first day I was depressed when when they told me the first day the 1st 24 hours they told me it's a girl I was like what the and because I was already thinking I was sure I was like 100% sure it's gonna be a boy And I was very depressed I almost died in the 1st 24 hours And then after that I got over it and then I fell in love with my girl And then and now I just want girls I don't want boys So this is um I don't know if you can see it we can pull it back up Uh There she is Little Italia with dad uh talking about uh healthy food and she's she's absolutely adorable Um And I love the name and um uh the name is because of the cars right Because of the cars and and just just so you know to answer your question about about six when I was six my dad is uh he was a painter So my dad was a painter all his life When he crossed the border he didn't have any paper So he needed to find a job So he became a painter super ethical guy I learned hard work ethical good core values from my dad And my mom and my mom used to be a teacher assistant in a Union Avenue Elementary School in in Park or in in in L A And then my dad was a painter So my dad would leave the house I would wake up and my dad would be gone Most of the time Right And and then when eventually when I started school we would wake up together and I would go to school He would go to work But my dad um he would always wake up early I would I wouldn't see him I would just see him in the night He would get home and he was exhausted tired and and from work from painting all day in the sun climbing ladders and things like that So we would come with a white like shirt like this but uh but not but white white shirt white outfit all painted like with with the marks And I would think that he was like a super hero and and fighting bad people I was a kid But then eventually I told him take me with you he took me with him and then I went to paint Holmes and that's the first time I saw Mansions in Beverly Hills in Bel Air and I saw a red Ferrari and that's when I told my dad you should have that car You should have this house How come we don't have a dad Like what's up with you And you know we're we're poor So my dad said it's not for us And that changed my life because I questioned him and I asked him why not And he said well if you work really hard and you never quit then maybe you'll be able to achieve that And I told my dad I am gonna achieve that And you were six when you said that I am I really believe it

when when we are I think it's around 6 to 7 We have we're still in that phase of like we haven't been luckily jaded because even if there have been traumatizing events because a lot of people have those in those formative years But I think at six we just really innately know where we're going and what we're destined to do And and I think um you know the drive in you is really incredible because uh I mean even the events it's called driven it makes perfect sense like it just sounds like once you saw that once you saw that experience you just didn't stop and and having your dad it sounds like a Hollywood movie in my in my brain Um Most of the events this is this is driven Um And uh for those that are watching that are meeting you for the very first time can you tell us a little bit about the event I know about it But for those that are watching that um want to attend or want to know more What what can we say Well driven is uh a place where people can come and learn business learn like my basic four principles that have helped me start seven businesses from scratch have been sales obviously because without sales you don't have a business and then marketing because if nobody knows you nobody pays you and and then and then uh systems and processes because if you never create systems and processes the business is never going to be worth anything because it's gonna rely on you And then training because the only way to take a company from 100 million to a billion is by training green people Because if you focus only on talent right now they're gonna have old habits they're going to be they're gonna be you know towards the end of their career they don't they don't like change they're outdated But if you want to scale a company from 100 million to a billion you need to get a bunch of green people that are straight out of high school college and train them how to become the elite loan officers or real estate or sales people in general So I believe in those four things and that's how we've been growing every company and four companies right now that we have they're all they're multi million dollar companies and and and I'm and I already have an exit plan for all of them but two of them are coming first and that's what we teach and driven We teach them how to start a business because there's no point of starting a mom and pop shop If you're just gonna keep a mom and pop shop you just created a job for yourself and you're gonna make less money you're gonna have more headaches more stress So there's no point of doing that And and that's what I like to teach people And I'm very uh I have a a very special place in my heart for my Latino community because obviously I'm Latino and I know how hard it is for us and everybody counts us out and and it's and you can achieve anything anybody any color any any any race any

part of the world you can be somebody big and great As long as you put up put the work and listen to the right information because today there's so many people giving you information but I believe that you need to watch the source of your advice and that's why we created this event It's already going on seven years So this is gonna be driven 7 2017 This is so exciting What I love about this and and learning about you is uh I'm like you in in a different sense Uh I was never given uh I always wanted a talk show ever since I was seven years old I would sit in my parents' basement and I would say welcome to the Michelle show I had no idea it was gonna be Michelle and Kyle obviously fast forward a few years Um But uh I think you know I came out here for acting and and hosting and things weren't happening for me And in 2019 I went back to school learn all the ins and outs of acting producing and writing And then I would get these like little moments of like oh I got an agent meeting or I got this or I got that And then in 2019 it wasn't moving fast enough In 2019 I was like I've had enough I I'm gonna create my own thing I just didn't know how or what Um And I created the show called The Charlotte Chronicles which is based off of my talk but that opened up a whole new world for me So I love your story of you wanted to be you want to speak and you wanted to talk but you created your own stage and your own platform Like it was I mean I watched I watched so many interviews and so many things about you but for the people that are watching like what what happened why did why did you create your own What was it for you Because you can't rely on anybody else Uh I can't stand people that always say oh it's because of that person or it's because of this person Uh It's because of my boss It's because of this whatever It's always because of you So you always have the last word and you control what you do You can't control what other people do but you can control what you do So I always wanted to speak on grand card on stage the 10 conference And I never got the opportunity before that I wanted to speak on Todd Duncan stage and that's a mortgage seminar I never got the opportunity I got tired of waiting and I just said you know what I'm gonna I'm gonna create my own stage I created my own stage and I didn't have the money I just I it was gonna be 50 K to start because I needed 25,000 for the deposit for the Ritz Carlton And I need another \$25,000 to pay a grant because he was gonna be my keynote speaker and I was gonna use Grant to take his audience So if you want to start an event and you want to fill it up pay somebody with an audience and they're gonna sell the tickets for you So IIII I knew because I I study a lot I have I've always been big on books mentors at one point I read a book a

week and and I knew that So I said I'm gonna get grant and I'm gonna sell tickets I'm gonna use his name and and I did that and I went to my one of my best friends at the time Uh He used to work for the company and I asked and I asked him hey buddy can you go 50 50 with me You'll be 50% owner of Driven and and Driven Made \$10 million last time And he could have been 50% owner He said he said no you know what um you you're you're not you're you're not a speaker It's risky And I said ok fine So I put 25 K of my money I didn't have much money That was probably all everything I had And I used a credit card to put the other 25 K And then I and then my wife is like well how are you gonna sell tickets What what's gonna happen We don't we don't have we don't have many employees maybe like one or two or or three or four or something like that And and and two of those were just people that were working on the website and they they weren't sales people So it was just me and I'm like how am I gonna sell tickets So I tell my team well I'm just gonna I'm gonna sell tickets and that's how we're gonna fund the event That's because the event cost it around 300,000 We only had 25 K and we use 25 K on the credit card So after 48 hours we have no ticket sales and I'm with we went to bar and in in uh on and we're sitting down there and I'm like ok let's let's let's eat and and I'm like man this is a failure another failure because I failed many times All my life and and I'm like and then I see my phone I get an email and it says new order uh \$2000 super VIP ticket Somebody somebody bought a VIP a super VIP ticket for two grand So I'm like now I'm \$2000 less in in the in the hole And then from there on we just yeah we we just sold more tickets because I believe when you do one thing you could do it again over and over and over again So I ran I ran with it and that's how it started So we got to get in the nitty gritty But I'm sorry I can't I have to interrupt you because we want to get Sylvia on his wife who is very much part of this Amazing amazing amazing Uh And uh yeah we can ask all those questions I'm sorry go that I know you have so many questions to leave at one We're good We're good OK OK I got Andy looking at me like so here is our Jackie and box it You wanna get it charged up You use this fantastic charger over here This is the output over there and it has an extra cable like this with the ability to charge it in your car So that is really cool So we have it all charged up It has here you can press on the display you can see now that it is not drawing any power it is not bringing in any power and it is 99% charged which is cool So as you want to use all your separate things you can turn on the little lights and it will show you as you can see there that now you can draw power out of them or you can turn them off just like you would

at home if you do if you wanna leave something plugged in but not having a draw power there you can turn it off So let's have some fun and see what our Jay can fire up So in the past we have used the Jari to light up our lives with go We have charged our cell phones and we have done a few other things but oh we've even lit up the Arrow Garden How amazing is that that we were able to light up the Arrow Garden But today we're gonna push the Jari to the limit and uh we are gonna take a look at the this works What's this This works That car vacuum Awesome Very cool And we could even take a look at Tabi used it And uh how amazing is this Oh my goodness You can just keep on going and going and going You can get into every little look and cranny in your car with all of this How awesome So this is what we're gonna do We're gonna stick it into our query Let's do it this way so you guys can see what I'm doing Turn it on It's a little light and the display have gone on because we are about to fire this up Thank you Mr Jay There we go That is cool So let's see what else we can fire up today I mean that you can I mean that is just so cool You see the today it's Wednesday April 26th 2023 We're so have you in the studio with me and the Kyle True Blood We have Albert Pros and it's important couples when they get on there Yes we we do We're not a couple but we are a couple We feel like we're like work spouses we're work spouses Um but I I heard about I met you yesterday Um and I instantly was like I love her outfit I'm very attracted to like what how you were and like you watching Albert and and I I when I was listening to your story you give so much credit to her about like you know even the name and like where you like how how far you've come and I just wanna know like what is it like to work with each other And and and I I know at one point there was like a circulation of five women and you became the one Yeah So first of all thank you for having us and yeah it was so nice to meet you We're really excited to be here and how it is to work with Albert Well it's challenging at times you know and working with your spouse is definitely not always easy but him and I you know we're a team and we remind each other of that when things get a little tense or we might have disagreements and we're ok agreeing to disagree at times Right But women were a little more into you know we rely on our intuition And for me personally I'm I love I like solid foundations and I like to know how right So when he tells me so we're gonna do Xy and Z I'm like shit OK let me like show me what it looks like what we're doing and give me an example and then I can put it together basically as what I do you know and I think what's helped us a lot is that we're very much we're like best friends like we're really crazy together very compatible And I always

like to say that he's a version of me if I was a guy and like we're very much the same It's where he's a little crazier than I am as far as risk taking goals you know and that's why we always say that he has gaps and I have gaps but together we literally have none which is really cool you know and we compliment each other and we just understand business after been together for so long you know and I got into the industry because of him So Wow Wow Yeah that is challenging huh When you have when you're different but the same uh you're learning from each other in certain ways Um so how how does that come to be with like you said you both come across as very intense and and and go getter attitudes right And when you're the same it seems that you would butt heads but it doesn't seem like it seems to be very uh very how do I say Well we we we grew together like I don't um I'm very I'm very aware of what I'm great at and what I'm bad at and and I don't focus on things that I'm not great at So I just focus on things that I'm great at like sometimes uh still she'll try to give me advice on social media and she's like and she's like hey you shouldn't you shouldn't put that word You shouldn't say that that that wasn't a good post don't post that And you know like it's pretty obvious that she's not good in social media and I'm I'm amazing on it and and uh like you could see with the insights you could see like millions of people see my page and only like 20 1000 people see her her page and and so so I know how to run the social media So I tell her how to do that and and and I I just don't let it get to me but when it comes for example to the company uh dealing dealing with employees for example uh operation systems uh she's the one So I stay out of it because whenever I try to organize plan something I create disasters So obviously that was a process in learning what each other's strengths were and allowing each other to be strong in your own way Can we talk about that a little bit Well I think that personally if I can you know say something I think what it is is that we've learned how to trust each other you know and it's like I know he's got certain things under control and I have certain things under control right And as you grow together see I was always that person you know my first book I ever bought at a library with a gift card or at a bookstore was uh business for Dummies right So I've always wanted to be better and and make money and I always wanted to be rich since I was little as well You know we have very similar backgrounds You know I was actually born in Mexico He was born here and probably he's been to Mexico more than I have But I grew up here I went to school here I did everything here basically So for me I'm like I'm I feel super American I'm proud to be Mexican and like he said we wanna help

our Mexican people But I would always go with him to events like if he would be like hey let's go do this I'd be like ok let's do it Like I'm always up for anything you know and especially if it includes learning because for me I've always loved quotes and things to keep me inspired you know growing up super poor like him you know I think we're just very similar very compatible and more than anything it's really the trust because I trust him with my life with my kids' life with the company like with everything I know he's got our back Does that make sense And what he's great at I suck at he's very much super driven Like I've never met anybody like him Like if he has 100 grand he'll spend two If I have 100 I'm going to spend 50 Yeah it's true He's a risk taker and he kind of does it before He has the plan I like to call it the Kyle plan As I go we'll call it the Kyle plan when they were making another big I'm gonna be like this is the Kyle Oh man I got trademarked by a millionaire Look at that No I I think it's really it's inspiring overall Thank you to see the you know the you know the old tale goes is that like two a couple can't be successful together Like House of Cards They're going to split Right But it seems just super strong You guys grew together It's you guys are very also about each other's weaknesses and strengths I think it's also very important You can talk about it I don't see anyone kind of grit their teeth on the other side of the chair Like well she'll she'll like I'll call her fat and she'll call me fat too because because I believe you're fat Yeah Yeah Yeah You're gonna do stairs No No Yeah you're you're fat you're fat I I do I do say that and it's because I believe that when when you find somebody and you fall in love with them right You fall in love with them How you how you meet them right So you should never regress you should always get better You should always look for progress So I believe that when you get married you out of respect for your significant other spouse you should always improve every day Even if it's 1% every day improve 1% So your wife your husband you should look better than when you met Not worse So I don't tolerate that I wouldn't be married with her if she let go of herself and neither would she if I let go of myself I I would hope so So I I just believe in that and I and it's it's disrespectful to your uh your your other partner because you should get better and not get worse Hold each other accountable That's really and we're also best friends So I think that's very important So like we we talk we talk to each other like best friends Yeah It's disrespectful If somebody's getting fat and you notice it disrespectful It's unethical for you not to say anything You're supposed to be the ethical thing would be hey you're getting fat stop eating That's true love I truly believe that myself You should be able

to tell and have those hard conversations but those real conversations and hold each other accountable And at the end of the day I feel like that's a positive because you're in essence helping that person get better not tearing them down I want to go back to the moment where you saw the VIP ticket come in What was it like for the two of you Was it like this like ecstatic moment of like oh my God Yeah it was one of the happiest moments of my life because because it's like when you get into real estate or mortgage you you some people are doing that for a year and they can get a deal and when you get your first deal and you close your first deal and you make your 1st 10 \$15,000 maybe more in commission you're like wow if I did it one time I can do it again And that's the only hope you need for you to move forward and kill it So when I got that ticket and then it was the most expensive ticket \$2000 I realized damn I could sell a \$2000 ticket right So all I gotta do is repeat repeat the process and I'm gonna get more \$2000 tickets and I did it and we did it over and over again We sold like I don't know like 100 or 100 and 50 something like that super VIP tickets for that event And and it's because when you find the way to do it just repeat it That's why you gotta copy what works I copied what Cardona was doing and it worked and to get to that space to get to that where we were like oh this works There's a lot of risk a lot of failure And you said that you were like I failed many times I caught that earlier And the resilience of that Did you guys know each other at this point when you were failing a lot I mean II I was I was an entrepreneur since I was six So I used to buy that's II I used to open all these businesses So for example when I was in in elementary school I use I bought a a CD RW drive which is the to burn CD Si I was selling C DS Yeah I and like I was I was 678 but uh I was a little kid like like between 667 and I would copy uh games and C DS and and I would burn them teachers Yeah I would have a deal that it's 10 \$10 a CD \$10 a CD Or if you buy like a 10 a 10 a package of 10 I'll give it to you for 60 bucks So so I used to collect I used to come home sometimes with 60 bucks 100 and 20 bucks 200 bucks Parents ask you like what are you doing I mean they probably thought I was selling drugs and and and uh but but they knew that I was doing that because my dad bought me my CD RW drive So I was very happy about the CD RW drive and then also uh I started uh buying uh Jordan's and and and I used to flip them so I used to go with my dad at 5 a.m. when I was a little kid 67 years old to get Jordan's and then we would flip him Same thing as real estate Right Yeah Yeah you were doing you were basically practicing for what you're doing now Yeah So those businesses did pretty good But but uh

the flipping Jordans was legit but selling C DS uh was kind of like not the most ethical thing but you know uh I think uh the statue uh or the law that they have it already Yeah it it already passed So I think I'm pretty safe Ok so so so so please just let me um focus on what I'm doing right now So so after that though I started other businesses online and e-commerce and and I and II I wired money and I lost it My dad gave me like eight grand I wired it and I lost eight grand and and so I failed I made a lot of mistakes but I learned and I think all of that the combination of me having to struggle being the first child and having to figure out everything on my own and having nobody to back me up But my parents forced me to become someone that that uh force force me to to get the best out of me to bring the best out of me And and that's how I think I started really supportive super super nice people You were such a good relationship and I feel like that So yeah we we're very close Me and my dad are like like Kobe and Phil Jackson So like we don't we don't talk a lot but like it's almost like he he gives me the look and then I give him the look back and we're like is your is your so your dad must be so proud and and your parents must be so proud of both of you for doing like incredible things And not only are you doing incredible things you becoming wealthy on your own But like you're also not only and I said this to my best friend the other day it's also what you're putting out into the world It's not like you're you're you're you're changing people's lives you're showing them that they too can do these incredible things And that is so so valuable and goes above and beyond any job Really You you you are teachers you said your mom is a teacher She was a teacher assistant for for school elementary school I think that's really cool And I think um I mean so I was listening to the interview yesterday with Marissa and um was it Grant Cardone book that you picked up in 2008 that in you And then were you starting to see people around you where you were just like I want to do that Like you're so again driven It just seems like I've seen so many people with this hat driven I before I didn't know what it was I make apologies because I'm I'm not in that world but like I actually know someone um that I'm working with He came um uh Bruce do you know about Bruce Cardin Yeah he wears a driven hat every day He comes in here and driven and I was like I was one day I was like what is that It's called brand awareness It's it's uh like when you have a brand uh one the advice that I would give everybody here if you want to become a millionaire quicker then you gotta create your personal brand and brand awareness So if if your brand is X make sure that you create T shirts hats uh you promote it you put it on social media and give them away for

free because you're gonna get known If you wanna get if you wanna make more money get more known People don't buy from from the best People don't buy from the most experienced people buy from who they know So for us like we have everything in life that we want or more like in two weeks we're gonna be in Maui we're gonna fly in a G 5 50 Gulf stream We're gonna go with one of our best friends Our kids are flying and jumping up and down They don't wear their seat belts in the jet and and we get there we're safe we got security we live in Bel Air like it it it's we can't we can't ask for anything So I said it yesterday What I wanna do is I wanna be the next Abraham Lincoln George Washington Martin Luther King Jr because once like like when you die even if you're a billionaire what happens when you die They remember you for one year They remember you a little bit for the second year 34 years they barely remember you After five years nobody cares or remembers you anymore So in order for for you to last in this world you got to be some you gotta something big creating legacy that way You're one of those three guys that I mentioned Martin Luther King George Washington Abraham Lincoln So when my daughter is 80 I wanted people to tell her hey your dad your papa was the great Albert Huh Yeah we remember that guy So that's what we're doing right now So the only way to get that is to reach more people to be on more podcasts to be out there increase your audience and help people because if you help a billion people you're gonna make a trillion I I so I still wanna create a show around youtube Um I think it's incredible and and and inspiring and so awesome And I this last question before we go I hate hearing that sound by the way because that means that our time is up But what is it like looking at your kids knowing that you came from Not very much and seeing them like look at like having this experience of being in a private check like family or and that's the challenging part because as parents we want overprotect and our our Children right However we have to we can enable them and that's what we're working on Like Italia She'll be like let's go to target to buy kids for toys for the kids that don't have any all but one for her and one for and one for her you know we're working she is a she says buy me more toys because we tell her you have all the toys already She says well let's go give them more new toys and then all my other toys we'll give it away to the to the poor kids So that's the challenging part because we wanna show them that it takes work to get here and we do that through you know like we create these charges She earns stickers Yeah she goes to the office and and they love it you know because our kids are home schooled So it's just it's being a parent is definitely the most biggest blessing However we

don't wanna make mistakes as parents but there really isn't a blue book to tell us And also 11 important thing also we gotta keep working hard and harder and harder and smarter as we grow Like I wanna work as hard as I can until I die Because it's unfair for my my my uh young youngest daughter or son to see a lazy dad to see a a retired dad that's on the couch Like because my first child saw me hard working and and getting us out of trouble and figure things out and and almost going almost losing it all and seeing me like not quit and and keep going I I want my my smallest ones to also see that hard working dad because I don't want him to grow up up and think like oh no life is easy and you don't have to work hard So I want I want to be a good example for the youngest just like I was to the oldest Right Right And that we do every day you know we teach them things You know if she says like I can't do something I'm like tell her how could you So now she tells her little sister no how could you do it It's really cute So um these are your cameras over here pluck away how people can can find you if they don't already know you which it would be insane if they didn't but let people know where they can reach you and you could just Google Albert Precio just Google Al Preciado and you follow me on Instagram Al Al Precio but just go Instagram because I'm horrible with social media if they if you guys Google Albert Precio wife Yeah Thank you so much for being on our show I was going to say on your show it out there to the universe Thank you for it's been an awesome day here at live Make sure you have a drink and then that is incredible I love watching on youtube We have a show called Driven Couple A chance me and now with great scarce and the
